Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs
recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and
that I have* **Recommended** *that she be* continued as classed,

without fresh record of survey, subject to rudder arms (EW)
indented shell plates B1 and 2, D1 and F1 (P.S.) and B2, D1 and
2 (S.S.) with structure in way being specially examined at
next drydocking. The vessel now

being fit to carry dry and perishable cargoes.
