We beg to return herewith your memorandum forms of the 17th instant respecting the steam trawlers "TERVANI", "LADY ESTELLE" and "COMMANDER HOLBROOK", and with regard thereto have to state that we are unable to obtain any information regarding the outstanding items of survey against these vessels, all of which have been taken over by the Admiralty, and the Owners are unable to furnish any information.

We should add that there are no trawlers of the Hull fleet working out of this port at the present moment, all our local vessels having been requisitioned by the Government.
