Dear Mr. McKinlay,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 4th instant regarding the case of the Dutch steamer "VEERHAVEN", from which I note that the Owners' Superintendent Engineer has called on you and informed you that it is proposed to arrange for a conference to be held at West Hartlepool with the Manufacturers of the Boilers on the 11th instant.

It is, as you will certainly realise, our wish to assist Owners wherever possible, but in this case it is not seen how a conference such as is proposed can serve any useful purpose at the present time, and one would have expected that the time for a conference such as that now contemplated would have been after a further examination of the vessel's boilers had taken place upon her arrival at Antwerp in March.

However, if the Owners make a special point of your coming over to attend the conference at West Hartlepool, it is assumed that they will raise no objection to our charging your expenses and a suitable fee for your services
