In reply to your letter of the 12th instant with reference to the equipment of the Steamer "MAID OF ATHENS", I regret I omitted to reply to the latter part of your letter of the 12th instant, and may say that no part of the cable is actually worn to  $1\frac{6}{16}$ ths; in stating in my letter of the 9th instant that the cable may be taken as full  $1\frac{12}{32}$ ", this measurement was arrived at by taking the mean diameter, by calipers and rule, of two measurements at a worn spot of a few selected links.
