Dear Sir,

With reference to the latter part of your letter of the 5th ultimo, regarding the equipment of the S.S. "MAID OF ATHENS", which is at present undergoing survey for classification, I have to inform you that the measurements of the vessel are as follows - length 240.9 feet, breadth 36 ft. and moulded depth 10 ft. 6 ins., which appears to bring the vessel to the equipment letter of "6", according to the present Rules.

The vessel has at present 200 fathoms of $1\frac{1}{2}$ ins cable, down to $1\frac{7}{16}$ ths, one length of which has been renewed, the fresh length which is not new, but has been previously used, has been supplied by the Superintendent of the ship, the size of which is $1\frac{7}{16}$ ths. The remainder of the equipment such as tow-line, hawsers and warps etc are being supplied and will be sufficient, and I shall be glad to know whether the cable may be accepted in this instance.
