Surveyed the steel screw steamer "E.G. SEUBERT", 9181 tons gross of Wilmington, on the 19th of August, 1943, and subsequently, while lying afloat and on dry dock at the works of the Sun Shipbuilding & Dry Dock Company, Chester, Pa. and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and that I have Recommended that she be continued as classed, with fresh record of survey 8,43, subject to permanent repairs being effected to bottom plating, etc., at first convenient opportunity. The vessel now being fit to carry petroleum in bulk.
