I duly received your letter of the 24th instant, and note that the Societe Lorraine des Acieries de Rombas have received an order for round bars and rivets intended for the steam trawler "T.8" building by Chantiers de Normandie, and that the former Firm desire that their name should be reinstated in the List of Steel Manufacturers approved by the Committee.

In the circumstances I have to request that you will inform the Society's Surveyor at Metz that he should make a complete examination of the Plant and methods of manufacture at this Works, and carry out a series of tests on material produced, in a similar manner to that adopted for new Steel Works.

The material for the rivet bars in question may be utilised for the purpose of forming part of the series of tests required, but the Surveyor should not sign any documents concerning this material until his report on the whole Works has been examined in this Office.

A fee of £15 should be charged for placing the name of the Firm on the List of Steel Manufacturers recognised



by the Committee, and, in addition, a fee at the rate of £5 per day plus expenses for the Surveyor's services in carrying out the inspection and tests.

I have to add that the above fees are not intended to include the ordinary charges for routine testing of steel material.
