Dear Sirs,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 28th instant in further reference to the Motor Trawler to be built by the Chantiers de Normandie, Grand-Quevilly, for Mr. Huret, of Bordeaux, and with regard thereto I am directed to inform you that, so far as the survey during construction of the hull is concerned, this survey will be carried out by Mr. MacGeachie, as arranged, and he will write the First Entry Report. It will be necessary, however, for you to join him in the survey, to give him any advice in your power, and to sign the report, in much the same way as the Principal Surveyor at a port in the United Kingdom joins the local Surveyor in a Special Survey No.3. The expenses incurred in your visiting Rouen should be charged against the ship.

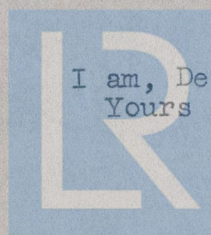
The survey during installation of the machinery of the vessel will also be entrusted to Mr. MacGeachie, who should be joined by you in the survey in a similar manner to that outlined above.
