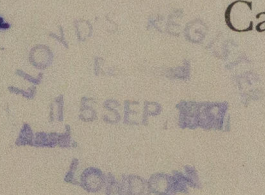

With reference to your letter of the 10th. instant relating to the steamer "KINGSWOOD", I give as requested the journal entries of Mr. Miller and Mr. Sellex respectively, regarding the survey of the auxiliary boiler, viz:-

Miller's Cardiff journal contains the following entry,

1. 23 Mar 1936. }

On relief duty at Swansea.

2. 26 " " }

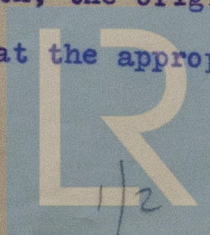
Sellex's Swansea journal contains the following entry,

1. 8th. Apl. 1936. "Kingswood" Pt.BS. Port Talbot.

Adjusted Auxiliary Boiler safety valves  
to 200 lbs. P.V. $\frac{1}{4}$ . S.V. $\frac{9}{64}$ .

On the 26th. March 1936, which was Mr. Miller's last of relief at Swansea he called at Port Talbot during the return journey to Cardiff, and surveyed the Auxiliary Boiler.

Upon his arrival home he wrote Mr. Sellex, and a copy of his letter is enclosed herewith, the original of which is fixed in Mr. Sellex's journal at the appropriate place.

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His entries relating to the other duties undertaken by him at Swansea are entered in the journals there, in the usual manner.

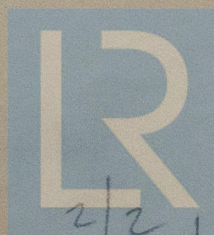
