Dear Sir,

I duly received your letters of the 24th and 26th ultimo in further reference to the case of the steamer "KINGSWOOD".

The arrangements made by you have been carefully noted, and I would thank you for your attention in the matter.

As regards the enquiry contained in the last paragraph of your letter of the 26th ultimo, I would say that there is no intention of disturbing the class of the vessel whilst on voyage to the United Kingdom, provided the temporary repairs recommended by you be carried out to your entire satisfaction.

Your Interim Certificate should recommend that the vessel should "remain as classed in the Register Book, subject to permanent repairs being effected on arrival in the United Kingdom".
