Surveyed the S.S. "PERSIER", 5382 tons gross, of Antwerp, as she lay afloat in the Roath Basin, Cardiff, on the 11th. Decr. 1944 and subsequently in the Mountstuart Dry Dock, Cardiff, with a view to the temporary closing of holes cut in W/T bulkheads &c. as a projected blockship and on account of damage stated to have been sustained in collision with the S.S. "STRATHDEN" on the 5th. November, 1944, -----

and that ^{we} ~~we~~ have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs

recommended by ~~me~~ ^{us} have been completed to ^{our} ~~my~~ satisfaction, and

that ~~we~~ ^{we} have Recommended that she be continued as classed *LOOA1 with fresh drydocking date 1.45, subject to further examination and permanent repairs as above and to deck plating &c. also to re-equipment as necessary on arrival at Antwerp to which port she is now proceeding. The class is also subject to indented sheerstrake plates Nos. 3 & 4 and bulwarks in way (port side forward). Permanent repairs to shell plates E.3,4, F.4, G.4 (starboard side) first convenient opportunity.
