The American engines built under survey and originally assigned to these ships were transferred to the United States Maritime Commission and the engines referred to in Montreal and Toronto reports mentioned above were later supplied in lieu.

The Montreal and Toronto Offices have, therefore, rendered their account of fee and expenses for the survey of each of these engines as shown on their reports and in their returns.

These fees have not been shown on the New York Reports or Rough Fee Book. Accounts should be rendered to the Admiralty for the agreed sum of \$4030.00 per ship, as shown on the above mentioned reports.
