Dear Sir:

I think it well to advise you that as the result of a collision on the 18th inst., R.B.No.31694 sank and is a total loss.

The other vessel involved was R.B.No.19274 which also caught fire as a result of the accident. This latter vessel is at present in tow of a U.S. Navy rescue vessel. A preliminary survey held while the vessel was under tow the following day revealed extensive damage.

No decision has yet been reached with regard to the disposal of the vessel, but she may be either temporarily repaired in Aruba, if practicable, or towed to Curacao.

I will advise you further when a definite decision has been reached.
