and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and that I have **Recommended** that she be continued as now classed with fresh record of Survey 7,44, subject to indented plates No.3, 2nd. below sheer (S.S) and 4th. strake below sheer abreast main mast (S.S) being dealt with at the owners' convenience.
