I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 23rd instant, submitting plans and specification of the proposed insulation in the case of the above vessel, and have to inform you in reply that the plans and specification will be approved, provided the fastenings of the insulation be to the satisfaction of the Society's Surveyors, the arrangements be as shown and amended on the plans and the remaining requirements of the Society's Rules for Refrigerating Machinery and Appliances be complied with so far as they are applicable.

With reference to the amendments shown on the plans and specification, I have to point out that the proposed single wood linings adjoining the general cargo spaces are not considered to be proof against the contamination of refrigerated cargoes by odorous goods which may be carried in these spaces, and that these linings should be double with waterproof paper between. Further, the woodwork should
