I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 8th instant relating to a proposal to fit in Messrs. J.L. Thompson & Sons' Yard No.588 (s.s. "SILVERLAUREL") refrigerating machinery taken from the M.V. "DEVON CITY", which was built in 1933 to the class of the British Corporation.

The matter has received careful consideration and I have to inform you in reply that, provided the refrigerating installation and its auxiliaries be opened up, examined and tested to the satisfaction of this Society's Surveyors, the electric generators be constructed under the usual conditions of survey and testing, the whole installation be fitted on board and the cooling down tests be carried out with satisfactory results, this installation will be accepted for classification with this Society and the notation of Lloyd's R.M.C. (in red), without the distinguishing mark "R", will be assigned in the Society's Register Book.

It is concluded that each refrigerating unit will be capable of maintaining the required temperature in the cargo chambers when working 24 hours a day in the tropics.
