First Entry



Gentlemen,

I have to inform you that it appears from a first entry report received from the Society's Surveyors at Dundee on the Steamer "SILVIO" that this vessel has proceeded to your port to have her machinery fitted on board, and that to complete the survey on the hull the following requires to be done, viz:- tunnel to be tested complete; tunnel watertight door to be examined and tested; downtown pump to be tested; bridge deck, casings, etc. in way of machinery space to be riveted up, and deck tested in way of same; tonnages to be completed, and pillarating in machinery space to complete.

I shall therefore be glad if you will give the case the necessary attention, and on completion of the work forward a report on Form 8 with a view to the classification of the vessel.
