We are obliged for your favour of the 24th. inst. re the Clyde Shipbuilding & Engineering Co. Ltd. (in liquidation), and read your suggestion, but although we are not conversant with Scotch law, we doubt if by following your suggestion, we would put matters in the proper shape and form.

It was the Clyde Sh. & Eng. Co. Ltd. who requested Lloyd's Register to inspect the building of the s.s. "ZONNEWYK" and to class her 100 A.I., and so it is to Lloyd's Register that they owe the fees.-

We have under our contract with the Clyde Shipb. & Eng. Co. Ltd. a claim for the Certificates, but we consider that Lloyd's Register are the creditors for the fees.-

We are sending your letter and also a copy of our reply to Messrs. Fyfe, MacLean & Co of your city, and we will feel obliged if you will kindly cooperate with these gentlemen in order that we may get what is due to us under our contract, for you

will no doubt appreciate that the question of the Classification
Certificates is very important to us.

These certificates should have been handed over to us on the
6th. of August, the day of the trial trip, when we paid our last
instalment, but as you are probably aware, they have to come

days later.-
