Dear Sirs,

S. I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 2nd instant relative to the fees and expenses due to Lloyd's Agent at Odessa in connection with the survey, by a Surveyor appointed by him, of the damage and repairs to the steamer "WOLVERTON" and I regret to see that there appears to be some misunderstanding on your part in the matter. I may remind you that in accordance with the explicit request in your letter of the 14th of April last, I cabled on that date instructions to Lloyd's Agent to appoint a competent and independent Surveyor to examine the vessel and supervise the repairs necessary to render her eligible to retain her class.

From the papers which have been received at this office it appears that on the 16/20th of April the Surveyor in question made out a lengthy report of the damage which had been sustained and the document would no doubt be handed by Lloyd's Agent to your representatives in due course.

The survey appears to have been carried out entirely in accordance with the request in your letter of the 14th of April and I have no doubt that on consideration you will see
