Thanks for yours of 1st. I quite understand the bearing of the loading question on the "Gretaston", and have in fact discussed same with Dr. Montgomerie. We told the Owners before the vessel sailed that we thought the loading was the worst possible for a new vessel. Nevertheless, unfortunately, these conditions have to be met, and while in the ordinary circumstances one would not have taken much notice of the matter, and certainly there is no need to be panicky about it, the fact of the vessel being built to the New Rules is sure to be referred to as a possible cause of the trouble.

Please thank the Chairman very much for taking such a personal interest in the question.

I shall be in London on Thursday and Friday next and hope to have the pleasure of calling upon you when we can exchange views.
