Précis of particulars of Casualty This vessel is reported to have sunk in forty minutes after striking a mine off Harwich on the 21st November, 1939.

Action has been deferred for two months.

In reply to the casualty notice, the Owners' London Office stated it had not been decided whether it was possible to save the ship so that they considered it would be premature to record her as lost. Action has been deferred for two months.

In reply to further enquiry the Owners state they are now in communication with the Admiralty with a view to the salvage of this ship.

If permission is given for an attempt, it is possible that salvage operations may be commenced within a short time.

14th May, 1940.

In reply to enquiry the Owners state there is no change in the position regarding this vessel.

They add they have no objection to the record "Sunk - War Loss 11, 39" being made against this ship's name in the Society's Register Book.
