ERIK FRISELL. — London, June 7. — Swedish motor vessel Erik Frisell was sunk by submarine last month. The crew were rescued by a British trawler and landed in a Scottish port.

SWEDISH STEAMER SUNK BY SUBMARINE

Thirty-four survivors of the Swedish steamer Erik Frisell (5,066 tons), of Stockholm, which was sunk by a German submarine in the Atlantic, have been landed at a North Scottish port. The crew had taken to their two lifeboats, but were later picked up by a trawler. The Erik Frisell was sunk by gunfire. The survivors stated that the U-boat commander showed them unusual consideration. They were allowed five minutes to get into the lifeboats. Three men were left behind by accident, and the others were given a chance to go back for them.
