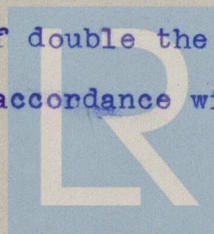

In reply to your letter of the 9th instant regarding the above and with reference to our letter of the 22nd instant forwarding a plan, in triplicate, for approval of the Automatic Feed Control proposed by Messrs. Laidlaw, Drew & Co. Ltd., Leith, we have had a opportunity of discussing this arrangement today with the Makers.

As requested we enclose herewith a pamphlet showing the Regulator and giving all particulars regarding the same. We have had an opportunity today of witnessing the Builders shop boiler plant in operation, a photograph of which appears on page 13 of the pamphlet enclosed.

The working pressure of the Regulator now submitted for approval is 60 lbs. The material of the headers is of cast brass, the connecting pipes being solid drawn steel, and these headers and pipes when connected together will be subjected to an hydraulic test of double the working pressure. The scantlings of course are in accordance with the working pressure required.

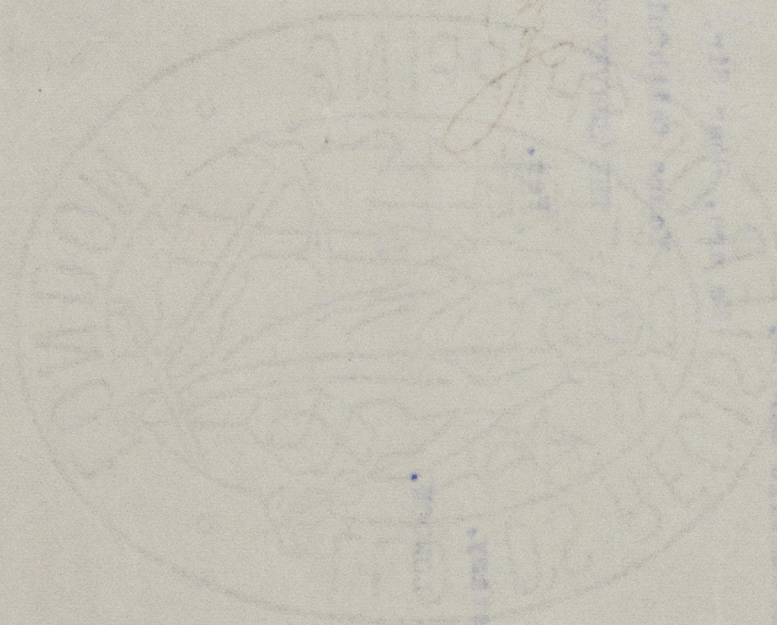
