Dear Mr. Cheetham,

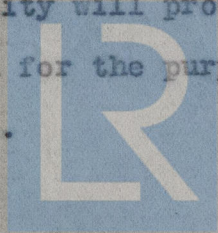
I confirm the following telegram which  
I sent to your private address yesterday, viz:-

"IT IS DESIRED THAT YOU WILL PROCEED BOMBAY LEAVING  
"LONDON THURSDAY NEXT FOR THE PURPOSE OF JOINING LOCAL  
"SURVEYOR IN SURVEY OF BRITISH INDIA STEAMER TAIREA NOW  
"UNDER REPAIR THERE STOP BUILDERS ARE SENDING TWO  
"REPRESENTATIVES FOR SAME PURPOSE STOP YOU SHOULD PROCEED  
"GLASGOW TOMORROW SATURDAY TO DISCUSS CASE WITH DR.  
"MONTGOMERIE TO WHOM ALL PAPERS ARE BEING SENT".

You will no doubt have obtained  
particulars of the case from Dr. Montgomerie today, and with  
a view to your conferring with the Chief Ship Surveyor on the  
subject here it is desirable you should proceed to London  
as soon as possible.

Your passage has been booked in the S.S.  
"RAWALPINDI", which left London yesterday, 27th instant,  
and will leave Marseilles on the 4th December; passengers  
to catch the boat at Marseilles will leave London by train  
at 11.am on Thursday next, 3rd December.

You will of course be in possession of  
a passport, but as its validity will probably have expired,  
you should bring it with you for the purpose of having it  
renewed on your arrival here.
