Dear Mr. Scott,

I beg to confirm the receipt of the telegram received from you as follows:-

"Some time back we made offer Lord Inchcape we should send out first class ship surveyor India to superintend repairs TAIREA TAKLIWA the surveyor to be sent entirely at Society's cost nothing to be debited to British India. Lord Inchcape declined offer. We now learn shipbuilders are sending out two of their most important men. In these altered circumstances we should prefer send one of Society's senior surveyors to Bombay for purpose supporting local surveyor. In view however of Lord Inchcape having declined Committee's offer previously it is thought well as matter of courtesy to apprise him of Committee's views and it is desired you will interview Lord Inchcape who we understand is at Glenapp and ascertain whether he has any objection".

I am sorry that I "misheard" the word Glenapp through the telephone and went to Greenock, but the receipt of the wire, of course, made this mistake clear and I returned to Glasgow.

I have been in telephonic communication with Glenapp Castle this evening but was unable to find anyone who could speak for his Lordship. A message is to be sent me, however, tomorrow at 10 o'clock on which I will at once act.
