Dear Mr. Scott,

I have your letter of the 29th ultimo,  
quoting cablegram received from your surveyors at  
Calcutta, giving the result of their joint survey.

As I told you verbally, we have arranged  
with our head iron foreman, who built this ship, to  
make an inspection at Calcutta, and the messages we have  
received from him are not quite of so serious a nature.  
I enclose copies herewith.

You will observe that he is writing us on the  
subject, and if the British India Co. agree, I propose  
that a decision on this matter be deferred until his  
letters and those of your surveyors are received. In  
the meantime, we may say that the reports indicate to us  
a state of affairs that cannot be accounted for by bad  
workmanship or design. Have you any record of the vessel  
having been ashore or in violent contact with a quay wall,  
or other similar happening?
