I am in receipt of your letter of the 15th inst, in connection with the case of the steamer "DYNAMO", Messrs R. Williamson & Son's No.230, and in reply beg to state that in my opinion the recommendations made to the Builders as contained in my letter of the 12th ult, and indicated on page 4 of my first entry report No.1839, viz., "that the vessel be placed in dry dock before completion to enable the matter to be attended to", be carried out, and that the classification of the vessel and the issue of the certificates be deferred until this has been done.

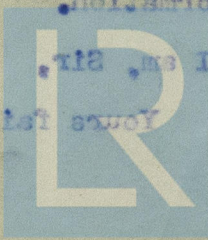
