With reference to your letters of the 10th and 19th instant, respecting the collection of the fees for the survey during construction of the Boilers made by Messrs. Babcock & Wilcox Ltd., and fitted on board the Steamer "WAR FIG", Messrs. The Monmouth Shipbuilding Co's No.368 vessel, I have to inform you that the matter was taken up with the London Office of Messrs. Babcock & Wilcox, who stated that they were not liable for the fees and that the account should be rendered to the Shipbuilders.

The Society's Surveyors at Newport were informed accordingly, and a telegram was received from them yesterday, stating that the fees for the survey of the boilers, amounting to £14:5:4, had now been received by them.

It is concluded that you have received the usual advice from the Newport Surveyors that the amount above referred to has been credited to your account.

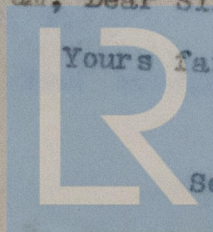
