Propellers, Sea connections, Outside fastenings, Part Machinery. Tail Shafts, Donkey Boiler. Electrical Installation.

and that we have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report stating that all repairs recommended by us have been completed to our satisfaction, and that we have recommended that she be assigned a record of "Examined 10,45" D.B.S. 10,45, (145 lbs/sq.in.) T.S.S. 9,45. subject to soft nosed stem and stern plating (S.S.) and A"4 (S.S.F.), being repaired at Owners convenience, and to liquid Cargo carried by the vessel having a flash point above 150°P.
