I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 19th instant, respecting the steamer "BALTEAKO", and note your remarks.

With regard thereto, I think it well to point out that the requirements of the General Examination do not necessitate the opening up of compartments neither do they necessarily entail drydocking. So far as the General Examination itself is concerned and recommendations for essential repairs, if any, it is usually found to be a matter of convenience to carry out this inspection concurrently with the survey for the renewal of the Load Line Certificate, which in this instance expired on the 19th ultimo.

In these circumstances, I shall be obliged if you will kindly favour me with your comments, and if it should be practicable for the outstanding survey requirements to be dealt with at Gibraltar I shall have pleasure in communicating with Messrs. Smith Imossi & Co. at that port, who deal with matters of this nature on behalf of this Society.
