I am in receipt of your letter of the 13th instant and may say that the above case was discussed with Captain Shankland at our London Office this morning.

As you will, of course, understand the Society's minimum requirements to enable the vessel to proceed to Rio de Janeiro via Cuba could only be prepared as the result of survey, and as you are still the Registered Owners of the ship, I shall be glad if you will be good enough to give authority for the requisite inspection to be made by the Society's Surveyors at Greenock.

It is understood from Captain Shankland that he is getting into touch with you in the matter and I may say that instructions for dealing with the case are being sent to Dr. Geo. Webster, the Society's Principal Surveyor for Scotland, who is stationed at our Glasgow Office, 5, Bothwell Street. Perhaps, therefore, you will kindly give the requisite authority to him direct.
