SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

MONTE ISABELA.—Las Palmas, Sept. 21.—Spanish steamer Monte Isabela, Las Palmas for Cuba, in ballast, sailed at 6 p.m. on Sept. 20 and is reported to have struck Gando Rock at about 8 p.m. Vessel sank, two of crew missing. Madrid, Sept. 21.—
Two of the crew are missing after the Spanish steamer Monte Isabela sank off Gando, near Las Palmas, Grand Canary, after striking a reef, reports reaching Madrid said to-day. Thirty-two of the crew were picked up. The Monte Isabela is considered to be a total loss, according to these reports.—Reuter.

MONTE ISABELA.—Bilbao, Sept. 23.—Spanish steamer Monte Isabela, sunk on Sept. 20 near Canary Islands when proceeding in ballast to Cuba, is a total loss; one member of crew lost. (See issue of Sept. 23.)

MONTE ISABELA.—Las Palmas, Sept. 25.—According to the local Press, it is believed that the Spanish steamer Monte Isabela sank owing to an explosion, as survivors state that the funnel blew up a quarter of an hour before the vessel sank. (See issues of Sept. 23 and 24.)
