The freeboard as marked upon the vessel's sides is as follows:-

Allowance for fresh water for all freeboards = 7 $\frac{3}{4}$ ".

This provisional certificate remains valid for one direct voyage in ballast from Rosyth to the River Tyne, the voyage to be completed before the 31st March, 1946.
