May, 1930, for the purpose of certifying the speed of the Vessel and the revolutions of the Engine.

The Vessel made 6 runs on the measured mile at Stokes Bay, and the following results were obtained:--

The propelling machinery worked satisfactorily during the whole of the trials, the mean revolutions being 303.5.
