Dear Sirs,

M. I am in receipt of Mr. Harbottle's letter of the 6th instant forwarding one from Messrs. F. & T. Ross, Ltd., of your port, from which it is noted with pleasure that they desire to have this Society's classification for their steam trawler "GIRARD", and that they are communicating with the Builders with a view to securing the plans in order that these may be dealt with.

With regard thereto I have to inform you that provided from an examination of the plans the scantlings are found to be satisfactory, and are verified by you, the requirements of Section 48 of the Rules for vessels not built under survey be complied with, and the Special Survey No. 1 be carried out, and the vessel be found or placed in a thoroughly good and efficient condition to the Society's satisfaction, the vessel will be eligible for classification in the Register Book.

Drilling will not be required excepting in so far as you may deem it necessary for the verification of the scantlings.

It is noted that the machinery was constructed under the survey of this Society.
