This is one of the Dutch vessels now being operated under the authority of the Netherlands Shipping & Trading Committee and for which it has been agreed that, provided such vessels are found or placed in satisfactory condition for a period of 6 months after general examination as set forth in Circular 1764, a record of Examined L.R. (with date) could be inserted in the Register Book.

The LONDON Surveyors report this vessel generally examined ^{afloat} in accordance with the above.

It is stated the vessel was dry-docked in June last at the Nelson Dry-dock.

The Surveyors recommend a notation of Examined L.R. 7,40 be assigned.

It is submitted this recommendation be concurred in [when the condition of the machinery has been ascertained and a favourable report received.]
