Dear Sir:-

I duly received your letters of the 21st ult. and 2nd inst. submitting for consideration Midship Section, Typical Bulkhead Plan and General Arrangement in connection with re-classification of the above vessel, and proposed conversion from a general cargo ship to a bulk oil carrier.

With regard thereto, I have to state that provided the vessel undergoes a Special Survey No. 3 as prescribed in the Society's Rules, the arrangements as shown on the plans be adhered to, and the materials and workmanship be to the satisfaction of the Society's Surveyors, the vessel will be eligible for a class +100 A1 "Carrying Petroleum in Bulk".

If it is intended to change the present machinery, or install new machinery, the same should be in accordance with the Rules, and plans should be submitted for consideration.

I take this opportunity of acknowledging signed request for the proposed survey for re-classification and alterations, and shall be obliged if you will kindly inform this office where the work will be carried out, in order that the Surveyor may be notified.

One copy of each plan has been signed and is returned herewith.
