Dear Mr Scott,

When Mr Cairns and I were in Kiel yesterday we were fortunate to meet Mr Daniel H. Cox of Messrs Cox & Stevens New-York at Krupps and as Mr Cairns knew him from New-York we were able to talk freely with him at once without having first to feel our way with each other.

He was ever respecting a duplicate Yacht to that at present building and also about a third yacht if he was able to come to terms with the Builders the latter to be built to the Society's Class for which he had brought over a Section which had been approved in the New-York Office.

It might interest you to hear that from the private conversation which we had with Mr Cox, he stated that the reasons for placing these orders in Germany was purely a matter of costs as there was a saving of not less than 400000 Dollars in the first Yacht as compared with the prices quoted in America.

The Manager of Howaldtswerke informed me that his Firm was in touch with the Standard Oil for similar Petroleum vessels to those ordered by them to be built at Krupp's, lets hope for the best
