Sir ,

I am forwarding by this post a partly-done First Entry Report N° 1267 upon the Auxiliary Steel Yacht "E L E N I", and with regard thereto, beg to inform you that we have been waiting for the last two months upon a wire calling us to Brest in order to see this vessel upon the slip, but when Mr. Laing was at Brest last week, he found that she had sailed for Biarritz. I, therefore, forward my report advanced as far as possible upon the hull; so little can be definitely reported upon the motor, which has not been opened up at all, that I consider it unnecessary to forward any machinery report.

I am sending in an account for the expenses only incurred by us and am leaving the classification fee to be applied for by the surveyor that completes the survey, when a portion should be credited to this office as you may decide.

I beg to draw your attention to the fact that the amount to be charged for classification has not been submitted to the Committee and I beg to suggest that the matter be now gone into.
