

With reference thereto, I beg to state that, through the Owners repairers in Brest, we have been requested to class the vessel in question as the Owner is not satisfied that Germanischer Lloyd class will be suitable for him. He has just bought the vessel in Hamburg.

She is stated to be classed Germanischer Lloyd +100 $\frac{1}{4}$ K
June 1919.

The two words after "presume" in our cable of the 5th instant were "WILD WAVE", the name of a yacht now in Brest which we thought corresponded with "ELENI"; we were in error.

I shall be glad to know what survey, etc., you wish carried out in order to class this vessel, if the Committee are agreeable to her being classed.
