Dear Sir,

With reference to the classification in the Society's Register of Yachts of the Steel Screw Schooner Yacht "MARION", and to the Fourth Special Survey No.1 which became due so long ago as July, 1936, I beg to remind you that hitherto the Committee have allowed this vessel's class to remain undisturbed in view of the undertaking which you were good enough to furnish in July, 1937.

The case has, however, been placed before the Committee at their meeting today in view of an intimation from the Society's Surveyors at Southampton that the yacht is still laid up in Poole Harbour, and I beg to inform you that the Committee consider that as the yacht does not appear to have been examined by the Society's Surveyors since 1932, an opportunity should be afforded at an early date for the Surveyors to carry out a general examination of the vessel with a view to reporting upon her condition and present state of up-keep to the Committee. I shall therefore be obliged if you will kindly let me know a suitable date when the requisite general examination can be held.

I have to add that in view of the length of time which has elapsed since the boilers of this vessel were seen by the Society's Surveyors, the Committee desire me to impress
