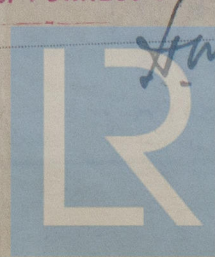

Extract from Section 1 of the Society's Rules for Yachts. The following Fees are to be charged to Owners or Builders for surveying yachts prior to their Classification in the Yacht Register when such Surveys are held in the United Kingdom :—

For the Special Survey during construction of Yachts (to entitle them to the distinctive mark \oplus), for each Yacht, whose equipment numeral according to the Yacht Rules, is

under 700	£9	4400 and under 6000	£27
700 and under 1100	12	6000	30
1100	"	1600	...	15	8000	33
1600	"	2300	...	18	10000	36
2300	"	3200	...	21	12000	36
3200	"	4400	...	24	12000 and above, a uniform charge of £3 per 1000				

For the Special Survey during construction of Engines and Boilers (to entitle them to the distinctive mark \oplus in red):—Five shillings per nominal horse-power for the first 250 horse-power; three shillings for each horse-power from 251 to 500; one shilling for each horse-power from 501 to 1,000, and sixpence for each horse-power beyond 1,000. No Fee to be less than £9.

For the survey and testing of each auxiliary boiler, a fee of Four Guineas will be charged.

MEM.—In exceptional cases an additional charge will be made according to the service performed, and in all cases where travelling expenses are incurred by the Surveyors in connexion with the above services, they are to be defrayed by the parties interested.

In no case can the yacht be classed until all fees, travelling expenses, &c., due thereon are paid.
