BRITISH STEAMER SUNK BY AIRCRAFT

FROM OUR OWN CORRESPONDENT

LISBON, JUNE 19

A small British cargo steamer, the Empire Warrior, was attacked by two German aeroplanes and one Italian at dawn to-day off the south coast of Portugal, near the Spanish frontier, and rapidly sank. The crew of 25 were saved by a Portuguese fishing smack and landed at Monte Gordo. A Portuguese coast-guard cutter later arrived to make investigations.
