The Mackay Radio reported last night (states Reuter) that the Napier Star (12,196 tons) was torpedoed at 6.35 p.m. Her position was given as lat. 58.58deg. north and long. 23.13deg. west. According to Lloyd's Register the Napier Star is owned by the Blue Star Line. Her port of registry is London.

The proximity of the three vessels is taken in America to suggest that a convoy was attacked.
