Sir,

S. I duly received your letter of the 16th instant, respecting the case of the Steamer "DELFIN", and with regard thereto, I have to request that you will be so good as to state definitely whether all the requirements of the Rules for the Sixth Periodical Survey, except as regards the drilling of the outside plating, have been carried out to your satisfaction; also whether the state of the plating is in your opinion such that the Owners' proposal to defer drilling the same until the subsequent First Periodical Survey (which would become due in four years from the present time) may merit the approval of the Committee without any drilling whatever being done now.

In regard to the Survey of the vessel's machinery, you will be so good as to let me know definitely whether the Owners desire the machinery and Boilers to be classed. In this event I have to request that you will make a careful examination of the Boilers and forward plans of the same with the present scantlings marked thereon. You will also be so good as to forward particulars and sizes of the

cylinders and all shafts on a First Entry Report Form.

I have to add that you should personally ascertain the dimensions from actual measurements.
