
Dear Sir,

S. I duly received your letter of the 23rd instant respecting the survey of your Bk"EURYDICE", and having been in communication with the Society's Surveyors on the subject, I am directed to acquaint you that it appears that the oxidation at the back of the frames in this vessel is such as to unduly distress the riveting through frames and shell. It is therefore considered that the Surveyors' recommendations with regard to the removal of this oxidation and the re-riveting of frames and shell should be complied with together with other recommendations made in order that the vessel may be eligible to retain her classification in the Society's Register Book.

Under the circumstances I have to request you will kindly state definitely for the information of the Committee whether it is your intention to proceed further with the Special Survey of the vessel in order to the retention of the class.
