I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 28th instant respecting your Bk. "EURYDICE", and to acquaint you that the case of this vessel received the careful consideration of the Committee of this Society today. In reply I am directed to point out that in my letter of the 12th June last acquainting you of the Committee's confirmation of their previous decision in this case it was desired that you would give instructions to the Master to arrange for the survey in question to be held in accordance with the Committee's wishes, and the Committee much regret to find that no steps appear to have been taken to give effect to their decision in the matter and that the vessel will consequently leave Nova Scotia without being submitted for inspection by one of the Society's Surveyors.

In view, however, of the fact that the vessel is now bound direct to the U.K. the Committee have agreed to defer action as regards her class upon the definite understanding that she will be placed in dry dock on her arrival at Ayr, her port of discharge, and be submitted for the Special Survey No.1 which is now so long overdue.
