Dear Sirs,

With reference to the classification in the Society's Register Book of your Bk. "EURYDICE", I beg to remind you that as intimated in my letters of the 9th and 12th June last, the Committee agreed to defer action in regard to the vessel's class subject to her being surveyed and satisfactorily reported upon by the Society's Surveyors before she leaves Nova Scotia.

The Society's Surveyor at Halifax reports that upon communicating with the master on the vessel's arrival at Liscomb the Master wired in reply, viz;-" have had no instructions re survey from Owners".

Under the circumstances I have to confirm the following wire which I sent to you today and now await your reply, viz:-  
"EURYDICE Halifax Surveyor reports Master states no instructions from you for survey required my letters 9 and 12 June last as condition of vessel retaining class please state what steps you have taken for necessary survey before vessel sails".
