

Caledonian Dry Dock - objects to her Dock because only  
one European Shipwright - advised however to go to  
Commercial Dock which has no Europeans at all -  
beheld 30 days in Dock - Capt. States remain dock - Ship  
there 30 days - Objects because there is no European Ass.  
See letter dated 4<sup>th</sup> Aug 6 - Finlay Muir & Co. Letter from  
Stewart 17<sup>th</sup> Aug objects to finish the beheld in the Caledonian  
Dock because no Europeans - W. Dean a shipwright  
attended all the time - 22<sup>nd</sup> Sept work done  
Issued a certificate 3<sup>rd</sup> Sep 1875 - Capt. & Muir &  
Capt. States Stewart did not bury beheld in dock  
Affidavit of the Sep of dock that Stewart never bury  
beheld in dock, never under bottom or in the hold -  
Jury early in Aug beated ship & found out what was wanted  
on two occasions beated her at 5.30 in the morning  
Capt. Stewart claims he has no interest in any dock or other  
Establishment - See Stablesman London Oct 1 -  
See Leader in Indian Daily News Oct 1<sup>st</sup>
