Dear Sirs,

M. With reference to my telegram of the 10th instant and letter of the 11th instant respecting the S.S. "ELLY", (ex "JACINTA"), I have to acknowledge the receipt of your telegram of the 15th instant in reply thereto as follows:-

"Steamer Elly owner propose vessel trading Baltic Northsea all British and French ports stop Vessel has equipment as required Rules".

With regard thereto I have to inform you that the service proposed by the Owners is considered too extended for the vessel, but a limited class could be recommended to the Committee for approval, such as A.1 "Coasting, England, Wales and to French Channel ports", and I therefore wired you yesterday as follows, viz:-

"Elly service proposed too extended could recommend class such as A one coasting England Wales and to French Channel ports".

It is noted from your telegram that the equipment is as required by the Society's Rules.
